Message from the Chair:

The IPMA had a great year in 2007. The IPMA Board successfully executed on its goal to reach out to its key stakeholder, the States' CIOs. A brief list of our successes includes:

- *Initiation of a second LeaderPath program with 28 students*
- *Two additional CIO Breakfasts*
- *Six professional development events with accumulative attendance of 565.*
- *Forum 2007 has 743 registered attendees*
- *A well attended and well received Executive Conference.*

The Board held its strategic planning session in November of 2007. In that session it reviewed and recommitted to the mission statement below. It also took a look at its operational responsibilities and committed to strengthening the tracking of its goals for the year.

The IPMA has developed into a respected and valued organization. It is through the hard work and dedication of its board members, volunteers and contract staff that it is able to achieve the accomplishments described below.

They enable the IPMA to continue a strong program of development opportunities for IT leaders, managers, and technical staff, as well as map new opportunities to advance the quality and professionalism of information technology in state government.

IPMA Mission Statement

The Mission of the IPMA is to help maintain Washington State's position as the nation's premier IT state by continuing to advance the quality and professionalism of the Washington State Government IT community. The IPMA is dedicated to:

- Promoting professional networking among state government IT managers, business leaders and IT industry leaders
- Enhancing the IT community's teamwork, collaboration and communications across Washington State agencies
- Providing professional development opportunities for the state's IT leaders, managers and technical staff that focus on

Organization and Membership Description

Organization

The IPMA is organized as a not-for-profit Washington State Corporation. There are no stockholders. There are 12 members on the IPMA Board of Directors and their term of office is three years. Directors are elected by the IPMA membership. There are three corporate officers who serve on the Board of Directors: the Board Chair, the Vice-Chair, and Secretary/Treasurer. No compensation is paid to any member of the Board of Directors for services as a member of the Board.

Statement of Membership

Membership in the IPMA is open to all current or retired state employees who are interested in information technology and who support the mission of the organization. Members support the mission of the IPMA by serving on any of the committees and participating in activities sponsored by the Association.

Although IPMA membership is reserved for current and retired state employees, participation in IPMA events is not restricted. During 2007, IT professionals from local governments and private higher education institutions participated in the year's events.

Forum

Program Description and Purpose:

Forum is an annual information technology seminar and trade show that has been held in Olympia since 1979. Forum continues to be an effective opportunity for vendors to demonstrate their products, for speakers to share their expertise and knowledge, and for state employees and others to attend free seminars and product demonstrations and to network. It is important to note that Forum is one of the premier technology shows in the Pacific Northwest and the largest to focus solely on the Public Sector.

Accomplishments and success measures for Year 2007

- More CIO's attended Forum.
- More panel presentations were included in the breakout sessions.
- Corporate sponsors included more panel presentations and reduce the number of stand-up, one-person presentations
- The Forum planning committee partnered with more agencies and corporate sponsors to ensure that Forum topics were related to key themes pertinent to the real work and priorities of government.
- Earlier advanced information about Forum speakers and breakout sessions were posted to the IPMA web site.
- The Attendee's brochure was successfully modified to show the relationship of breakout content to job types.
- The Forum brochures were combined into one document for ease of use.

CIO Breakfast

Program Chairs: Allen Schmidt, Phil Grigg

Program description and Purpose:

This program is specifically designed to provide state Chief Information Officers (CIOs) the opportunity to meet together in an informal setting to discuss issues and share information. It also provides the opportunity for the IPMA to network with the state's CIOs, receive feed back on IPMA activities and demonstrate the value of the IPMA. The IPMA hosts and facilitates the seated breakfast and asks a few CIOs to help plan and organize the agenda for each event.

Accomplishments and Success Measures for Year 2007

Two CIO Breakfast were held in 2007. One was held on April 17th and another on October 2nd in conjunction with the IPMA Executive Conference.

Evaluations by CIOs were very positive, indicating they found the sessions quite valuable. Over 88% of the CIOs indicated they would like to meet quarterly instead of semi-annually.

25 out of 39 CIOs attended both events. In both cases 16 evaluations were returned.

Executive Seminar

Program description:

This is an annual event bringing together approximately 100 government information technology executives and industry representatives for a three-day seminar to discuss topical issues. Reservations are required.

Accomplishments for 2007:

The 2007 Executive Seminar was held at Campbell's Resort at Lake Chelan October 1st – October 3rd. The Seminar was full and we held a total of 105 rooms with 110 people attending. This was seasonally the latest we have held the seminar and the weather did not co-operate with rain and wind for at least a part of the time. The Seminar conducted nine speaking sessions and the CIO Breakfast (see CIO Breakfast Report).

Program description:

The committee is responsible for the IPMA web site, the IPMA marketing plan, promoting membership in the IPMA and maintaining the IPMA associate membership roster. The web site serves as a means of apprising members of IPMA events, actions taken by the Board of Directors, and other information of interest.

Accomplishments for 2007:

- Developed a brochure that tells the story of the IPMA - what it is and why it's important to the IT community. This included a standard business card sized insert. The brochure contains general information about the IPMA. The card contains board member names and dates of 2008 IPMA events and will be updated following the election of new board members. The first distribution of the brochures/cards was at the Executive Seminar.
- Worked with the sub-committee on the Event Registration System. The system is still not in place but a Lessons Learned document was developed.
- Continue Emphasis on Marketing to CIOs - The CIOs have become more engaged in the past year. A small group of CIOs have participated in planning the CIO breakfasts. There has been very good attendance at the CIO breakfasts.
- Updated and maintained the list of CIOs.

Assisted in the following events:

- Forum – worked as co-chair with Jim Anderson on Planning Committee and helped identify future strategies for Forum, surveyed CIOs to solicit input about the Forum, and provided coverage for the IPMA booth.
- LeaderPath – worked with the University of Washington and Department of Personnel to develop the second LeaderPath offering. Served as steward for the Enterprise Portfolio Capstone Project.

LeaderPath

Program Description and Purpose:

LeaderPath for IT managers is a professional training experience for mid-level managers positioned for the next generation of technology leadership. Its purpose is to prepare managers with the “new competencies” that the next generation of technology leaders must have in order to be successful. These competencies included having an enterprise mindset, the ability to initiate and enable change, and creating cross-functional actions which yield common ground solutions.

Accomplishments and success measures for Year 2007

- 2007 class was a “go”
- 2007 class was filled to capacity
- IPMA did not need to subsidize the class
- Capstone project process effort was tuned to provide better linkage with the learning objectives
- Capstone project Stewards were found and stepped forward to actively participate
- Program kick-off event went smoothly and was received well by participants
